Most Holy **Trinity**

On Sunday, June 15, we celebrate the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. The word Trinity is a title for God that means he is three Persons in one God!

Before Jesus came, people didn't know that God was three Persons. The Israelites knew that there was only one God, but they didn't know very much about him. Jesus taught them about the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The three Persons in the Blessed Trinity are all equal -but different. We cannot understand this, but we believe it because Jesus taught it. It is one of the mysteries of our faith.


